Read.

Articles are words that defines a specific or unspecific noun.

Articles are of two types -

Articles

Definite

(The)

Indefinite

(A and An).

Indefinite article (A, An) shows the thing in general. It means they don't refer to any particular person, animal or thing. That is why, they are called indefinite article.

Examples - a car, an umbrella,
a bus, a kite.

Definite article (The) is called the definite article because it always point out or refers to a particular person, place or thing.

For examples,

- The Sun, The Moon, The clown.
The watch.

Rules

① (a) 'A' is used in front of singular countable nouns (a person, animal or thing) which are not specific.

For eg - A ball, a car,
a bus,
a kite.

② (b) 'An' is used in front of singular countable nouns which are not specific.

For eg - an umbrella, an egg,
an ice-cream.

③ (a) If a noun begins with a consonant (b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k etc), 'a' comes before the noun.

For eg - a bag, a book
a doll, a cat.

④ (b) If a noun begins with a vowel (a, e, i, o, u), 'an' comes before the noun.

For eg - an egg, an umbrella,
an orange, an ink-pot.

③ (a) We use 'A' before words that begin with a vowel and gives the sound of 'you' (consonant sound).

For eg- a Uniform, a European

a Useful gift.

a University.

④ (b) We use 'An' before a word begin with a silent 'h' and it sounds like vowel.

For eg- an Hour, an Honest man

an Honourable person.
